Canada full control over immigration. Canada can issue an order closing the country to settlers from all foreign asiatic countries, or to people of particular races, and there is nothing in the treaty with Japan which interferes with the exercise of this right. That is a kind of private agreement, not sanctioned by a formal treaty. Canada cannot enforce this understanding, and it can be terminated by Japan at any time. The only sure guarantee of Canadian protection from Japanese in minigration is the power to registe and legislate in the premises. That power was signed away by the Laurier government, and most of the Japanese now in the country came while the country was wide open.
