

THE GOVERNOR GENERAL.

His Excellency the Right Honorable CHARLES STANLEY VISCOUNT MONCK, Baron Monck of Ballytrammon, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of Ireland, and Baron Monck of Ballytrammon, in the County of Wexford, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Governor General of Canada, &c., &c., &c.

Son of Charles Joseph Kelly, 3rd Viscount by the daughter of John Willington, Esq., of Killoskehane, County Tipperary, Ireland. Born 10th October, 1819. Educated at Trinity College, Dublin. Called to the Irish Bar, in 1841. Succeeded his father as 4th Viscount, 20th April, 1849. Married 22nd July, 1844, his cousin Lady Elizabeth Louise Mary Monck, fourth daughter of Henry Stanley, Earl of Rathdowne. Was a Lord of the Treasury in the Palmerston Administration. Sat for Portsmouth, in the House of Commons, Eng., from July, 1852, until g. e. 1857. Was an unsuccessful candidate for Wicklow in May, 1848, and for Dudley in Worcestershire, in 1857. Was Governor General of British North America, from 2nd November, 1861, until appointed Governor General of the Dominion of Canada, 1st July, 1867.
