the Field Officers and Captains of Militis or Lieutenants commanding companies.

One copy only to be transmitted to the same person.

the Peace, to the Field Officers and Captains of Militia, of each Parish in this Province, and on the death or dismission of any Captain of Militia, then the same to be delivered over to his Successor in other: Provided always, that only one Copy thereof in both Languages, shall be transmitted to the same person, at the Public expence.

CHAP. II.

An Act to facilitate the Negotiation of Promissory

Notes. [31st May, 1794.]

Preamble.

HEREAS it will tend to the encouragement of Trade and Commerce within this Province, that the negotiation of Promissory Notes be facilitated Be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and Consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the Authority of an Act of the Parliament of Great Britain, passed in the thirty first Year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled "An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province "of Quebec, in North America, and to make further provision for the Government of the faid Province," And it is hereby enacted by the Authority of the same,

All Promissor Notes figured by any person, shall be held to be due to the person, to whom made payable.

And all Promittory Notes payable to order, thail be affiguable by indorfement, specifying the day of affigument, to whom payable, and that the indorfement was made for value recrived.

And shall be so inderied by every new transfer thereof.

The payer may maintain an action against the maker of any such Note.

Or against any drawer or indosfer.

And the Plaintiff shall recover durages and Colls. But upon a nonline or Verditt against the Plaintiff, Defendant shall recover Costs. Persons recovering principal debt may sue out Execution for durages and costs.

That from and after the passing of this act, all Notes in writing, commonly called Promissory Notes, hereafter to be made and signed by any person or persons, or by his, her or their Attorney or Attornes, legally authorised to sign such Promissory notes for him, her or them; wherehy such person or persons, his, her or their Attorney or Attornes as aforefaid, shall promise to pay to any other person or persons, his, her or their Order, any Sum of Money mentioned in such Promissory Note, shall be taken and construed to be, by virtue thereof, due and payable to any fuch Person or Persons to whom the same shall be made payable, and also every such Promissory Note, payable to any person or persons, his, her or their order, shall be assignable and indorscable over to any other Perfon or Persons, by an Indorsement, or Assignment written and signed on such Promillory Note, specifying the date of such Indorsement, the name of the Person or Persons, to whom or whose order such Note is indorsed, and that such transfer is made for value received; and shall, by every new holder or holders under fuch Indorsement or Assignment as aforesaid, be further indorfeable and affiguable to any other person or persons, in the like manner, as often as the case may require: and that the Person or Persons to whom fuch fum of Money thall be, by fuch Promissory Note, made payable, thall . and may maintain an Action for the fame against the Person or Persons who, or whose Attorney or Attornies as aforesaid, made and signed the same; And that any Person or Persons, to whom such Promissory Note that is payable to any Person or Persons, his, her or their Order, shall be indorfed or affigned, or the money therein mentioned, ordered to be paid by Indorlement or Allignment thereon as aforelaid, shall and may maintain his, her or their action for fuch fum of money; either against the Person or Perfons who, or whose Attorney or Attornies as aforesaid, made and signed luch Promissory Note, or against any of the persons, who indorsed or alligned the same as aforcsaid: And in every such Action, the Plaintiss or Plaintiffs shall recover his, her or their damages and Costs of suit. And if fuch Plaintiff or Plaintiffs shall be nonsuited, or a Judgment or a Verdict be given against him, her or them, the Desendant or Desendants shall recover his, her or their Costs against the Plaintiss or Plaintiss; and every such Plaintiff or Plaintiffs or Defendant or Defendants, respectively recovering, may fue out execution for such damages and Costs, in such manner as is lawful in other cases; any Law, Usage or Custom to the contrary notwithstanding. · Pro
