

Clarke, are brothers. B. in Darlington, Co. of Durham, Ont., 8 Jan., 1852. Ed. in Durham Schools, Toronto Provincial Medel and Normal School and at Univ. of Toronto. Holds 1st Class "A" Provincial, Public School Inspector's, and Honor Certificates in English, French, German and History from Univ. of Toronto. M., 1st, in 1872, Caroline J., dau. of Major Isaac Preston, a U. E. Loyalist family, late of Vancouver, B.C., and 2ndly, Mary E., dau. of Harvey W. Burk, ex-M.P., West Durham. Has been the editor and publisher of the *Victoria Warder*, Lindsay, since 1885. Taught school in Belleville, Lifford and Bowmanville, and was first English Master of Toronto Collegiate Institute for 10 years, retiring in 1885. Past County Master Victoria Co. Orange Assoc., and Grand Officer of Grand Orange Lodge of Canada. Holds 1st and 2nd Class certificates of efficiency from the Canadian Military School of Instruction. Was Major and Adjutant 45th West Durham and Victoria Batt., V. M., is now Senior Major and has acted as Brigade Major 3rd Military Dist. Is Presdt. of Victoria Co. Rifle Assoc. and Vice-Presdt. of the Dominion of Canada Rifle Assoc., and the Province of Ontario Rifle Assoc., as well as on the Council of each. Has been a mem. of the Board of Education and of the Council of the Board of Trade, Lindsay; and has been Vice-Presdt. of the Toronto Lacrosse Club. As an athlete in 1872, won the champion mile race of America. Is the projector of the Lindsay, Bobcaygeon & Pontypool Railway, and is Presdt. of the Haliburton & Mattawa Railway Co., of the Gelert to Huntsville Railway Co., and of the Hughes Car Ventilating Co., Ltd. First returned to Parlt. at by-election of 1892, held in consequence of the unseating of Mr. J. A. Barion, who had defeated him at g. e. of 1891. Re-elected at g. e., 1896.
