CHAP. I.

AN ACT to ascertain and establish on a permanent footing, the Boundary Lines of the different Townships of this Province.

[Passed 5th July, 1798.]

W HEREAS it is expedient and necessary to ascertain and establish Preamble. upon some permanent principle, the Boundary Lines of the different (See 50 Geo. 11. Ch. 14. Townships within this Province, and distinctly to preserve them when so $\frac{1}{2}$ Vie. Ch. 17. ascertained and established, Be it enacted by the King's most Excellent 3 Vie. Ch. 11. Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Upper Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled, 'An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec, in North America,' and to make further provision for the Government of the said Province," and by the authority of the same, Monuments to be placed That stone monuments, or monuments of other durable materials, shall at the corners, &c. of each Township and Concession be placed at the several corners, governing points, or offsets of every Township that hath been surveyed, or may hereafter be surveyed; and Lines therefrom to be also, at each end of the several Concession lines of such Townships; and the permanent Boundar that lines from the monuments so erected, or to be erected, be taken and and concession considered as the permanent boundary lines of such Townships and Concessions respectively. 111
