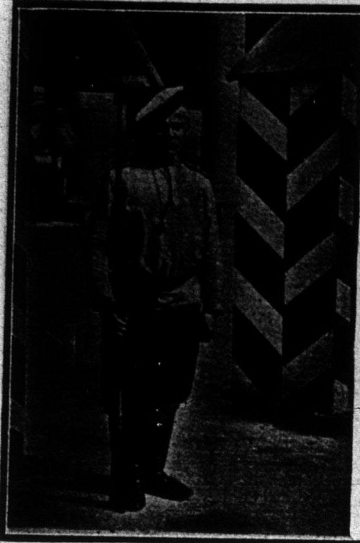

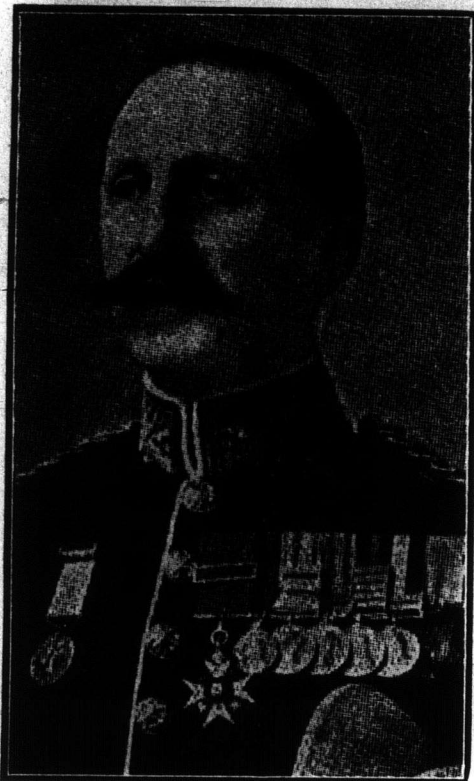

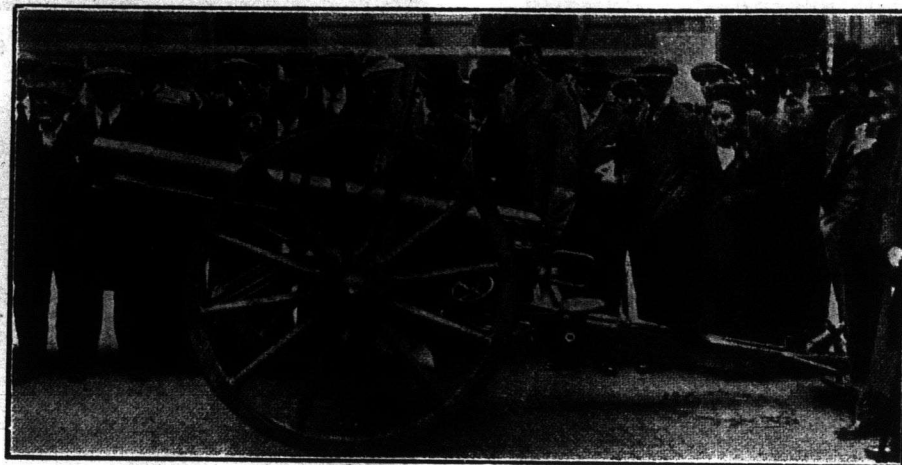

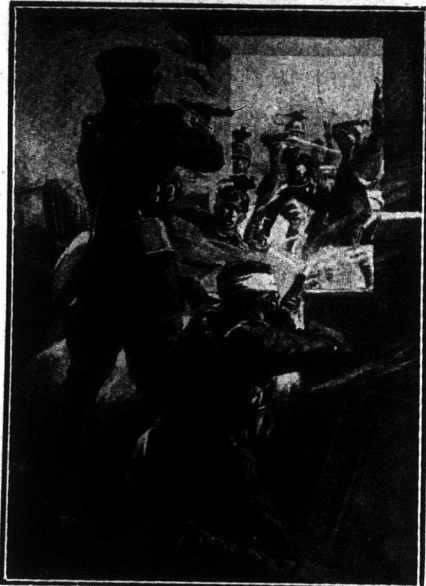

The first captured German Gun brought to London.



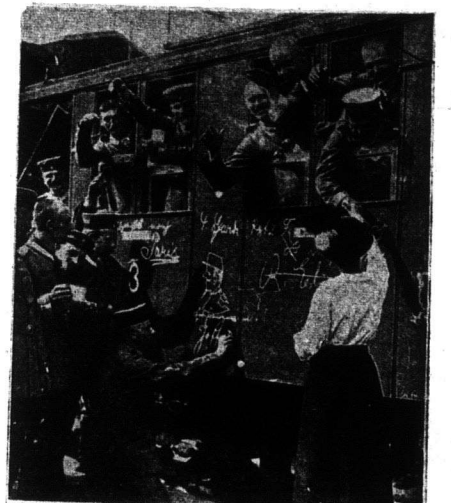

A German machine gun was necessary to destroy two Irish Guardsmen.

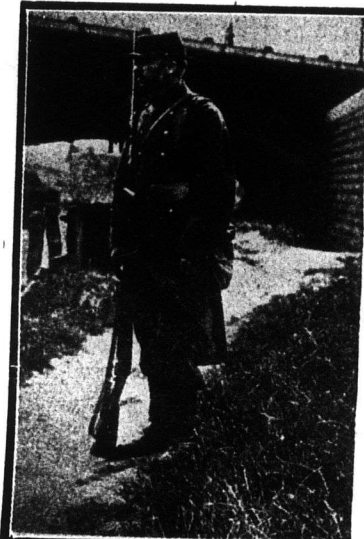

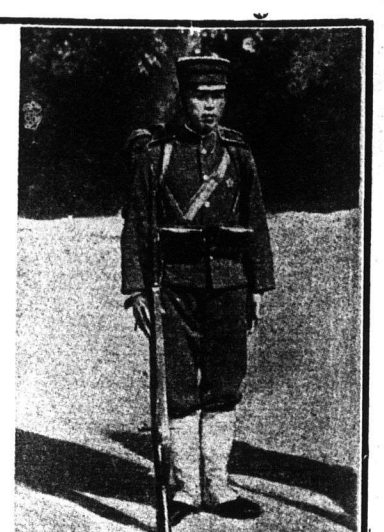
