

Say, how about a return-deposit for auto bodies?

D. G. Stoker, who works with Ontario's Ministry of the Environment, says bottles and cars should be treated alike.

Charging a deposit on bottles encourages buyers to return them to the retailer. This means bottles don't become unsightly and dangerous litter.

Stoker recommends a deposit on car bodies (perhaps \$100 or \$1,000 levied at time of purchase) to be returned when the car body is worn out and ready for the wreckers' yard. That way old cars won't be abandoned on roadsides

and in fields, he says. This is just one of the ideas that he will present at a talk scheduled for Tuesday, Nov. 25 at 8 p.m. at Port Credit library.

He is first speaker in a series on environmental issues which Port Credit library is organizing. Title of his talk is The Environment — and What the Ontario Government is Doing About It.

Women

Helen Tucker of Douglas Dr. in Mississauga will discuss The International Woman, at

This will be a report on the World Congress for International Women's Year, which was held in Berlin in October.

Object of the congress was to implement some of the ideas arising during IWY.

Music

Music is to the fore at two Mississauga Libraries this week.

On Sunday, Nov. 23, at 2:30 p.m. there's a pop-rock, jazz and middle-of-the-road session at Central library.

A local group will perform. They are Mike Lemski, vibes and keyboard; Steve Whittick, guitar; George Hirst, bass; Paul Michels, percussion; and Karen Simms, vocals. On Tuesday, Nov. 25, at

Clarkson-Lorne Park library at 8 p.m. a brass ensemble from Hamilton Philharmonic Institute will appear in concert.

The group is composed of John Langley, bass trombone, a graduate of University of Toronto; David Jones, trumpet, from Montreal; Gary Nagels, trombone, who has worked for CBC and the National Arts Centre Orchestra; and Ed Nixon, trumpet, who has worked with Toronto Symphony.

Talk

Also on Tuesday at the Clarkson library, this time at 9 a.m., there is a talk by Donald A. Newgren, an associate professor in the faculty of fine arts at York university.

He will be discussing his work as a communications consultant in the series Discovering People, sponsored by Sheridan college.

He has been involved in supervising design and production of major publications for the fine arts faculty, and museum and exhibit design. He has also been a consultant to government and industry on graphic and exhibit design.

Play

On the same day, 8 p.m., discussion of a play is scheduled for Park Royal library. David French's Leaving Home, about a family transplanted from Newfoundland to Toronto, will be examined.

Library staffer Alice Agar, who will lead the discussion, says French's play is impressive because it is an honest portrayal of a family relationship which is brutally and even physically destructive.

The father, Jacob, would like to love his sons, but seems only able to antagonize and alienate them, particularly the older son, who is driven to leaving home.

"Jacob feels betrayed by his

wife and sons, disillusioned by his own life and his dashed expectations.

"He constantly berates and rides his sons, in the desperate hope that he can force them to conform to his unrealistic notion of what a father-son relationship should be.

"It is the kind of warfare we can understand. At the same time, French relieves the tension with a truthful and earthy dialogue from his characters," says Ms. Agar.

Authentic Redbone

Leon Redbone, Warner Bros. — BS2888. Leon Redbone, blues singer, is a stickler for authenticity and a damn good stickler. Redbone doesn't break any new musical ground, but serves to point up in very accurate detail the days of old. With an ageless voice and a mean guitar, he runs down tunes like My Walking Stick, Ain't Misbehavin' and Big Time Woman so well that you'd swear you were back in the 1930s and 1940s.

A lot of credit for getting Redbone on record without losing that old-time flavor goes to Joel Dorn, who as always has more taste than most people have skin. If you like this kind of music, you'll love this album: if you don't, you should try it because it's pretty contagious. David Crosby, Graham Nash. Wind on the Water. ABC Records — ABCX 902.

This is a distinct duo with two of the best and easiest-to-listen-to voices in

rock. However, they falter on one account: The material they write is extremely lacklustre and at times plain boring.

The backing they receive by people like Russ Kunkel, Tim Drummond, Craig Doerge and Danny Kottchmar is first rate.

In passing, I note that Round Records has opened a store at University of Toronto's Erindale campus in Mississauga. This is Round Records' second store. The first was opened about five years ago on Bloor St. and it has been my experience that the store has brought lower prices, knowledgeable staffers and very human service to record buyers. The Erindale store is a franchise operation owned by the student council. The prices are the same as at the downtown Round Records' store and profits go toward student activities.

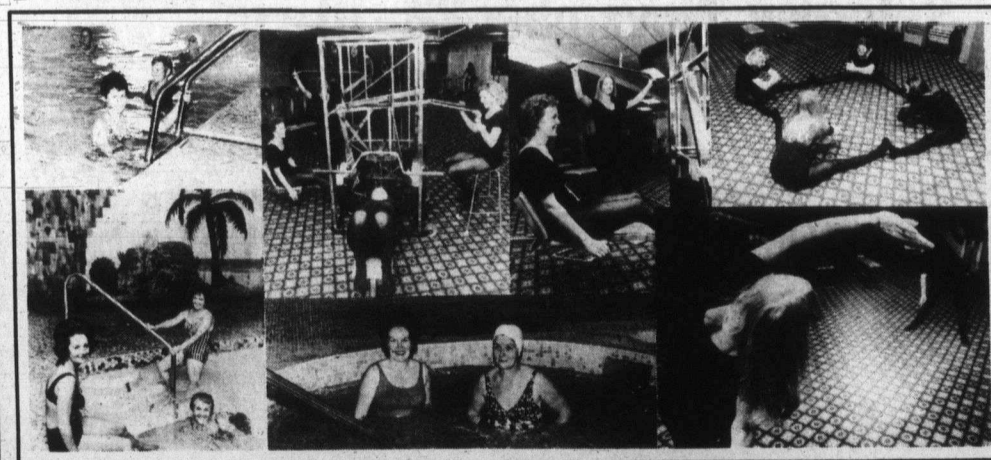
