
Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 17th instant, in which you state that while the land in connection with the Agency residence at Christian Island is not suitable for farming it might, you consider, be cultivated to advantage in raising fruit.

The Department will allow you to purchase fencing, where-^{material} with to enclose five acres of land for growing fruit. It is understand that you have the land prepared for planting. If it is in proper condition you may purchase fifty apple trees and set them out. The account for the trees and also the account for fencing should be forwarded to the Department, in the usual way for payment.

If any additional fencing is required you should give an estimate of cost, stating the amount of fence required to be constructed.
