Sir,-

With reference to work which was done to the Agency House at Walpole Island, while you held office as Indian Agent, in regard to which you wrote the Department on the 21st January, I have to request that you will state what price you place upon the screen doors and windows. When you furnish the Department with information to the above effect, the price which you quote will be submitted to Mr. McCallum and if he states it is reasonable, the Department will consider payment to you for the articles in question.

The Department desires to be informed why you certified to Mr. Taylor's account for papering all of the agency house, in view of the fact that two large rooms downstairs were not papered. You should also explain why you disposed of the surveyor's chain and lumber to Robert Johnson without authority from the Department.
