Ottawa, April 13th., 1916.

Sir:-

With reference to the case of Madge Steinhauer, pupil No. 098 of the Red Deer Industrial School, who was operated upon in the Red Deer Hospital by Dr. Collison of Red Deer, I have to request that you will inform the Department whether you requested Dr. Collison to take charge of the case. I may say that the following report was made to the Department by Mr. Woodsworth, Principal of the Red Deer School.

"Dr. George grew alarmed at certain symptoms of the case indicating a gathering further in the head which if allowed to develop might prove fatal. She was taken to Dr. Collison whom Dr. George wished called in for consultation and was by him sent to the Hospital."

Mrs. Woodsworth also stated, when he made the above report, that Dr. Collison wished to treat and study the case for two or three days until he felt sure what was necessary. Be good enough to inform the Department how long the case was under observation by Dr. Collison before he operated, and also how long the patient remained under his care after operation.
