
Sir,

In reply to your inquiry respecting the grading of pulpwood and the dues thereon, I have to inform you that the 40 cents per cord rate applies only to spruce, or to spruce with a certain percentage (usually not over 20%) of balsam fir.

Any other woods cut for pulp purposes should be rated as hardwood (hard or soft) with the corresponding scale of dues at 25 or 30 cents per cord respectively.

A cord is considered to be 120 cubic feet.
