Sir

The reply to your inquiry respection the grading of pulpwood and the dues thereon, I have to inform you that the 40 cents per cord rate applies only to spruce, or to appace with a certain percentage (usually not ever 20) of bulsam fir.

Any other woods out for pulp purposes should be rated as condwood (hard or soft) with the corresponding coals of bues at 20 or 70 cents per cord respectively.

'A cord is considered to be 120 cubic feet.
