the hot houses at small cost, and planted 3,000 to the acre, and produce, according to the season, 15 to 25 tons per acre. Prices range from \$12 to \$20 per ton for canners, and for semi-ripes from \$30 to \$50, early ones bringing higher prices.

ONIONS. Kelowna is the chief centre for onions in Western Canada. This important crop, grown from seed on fine, loose soil, produces under ordinary conditions from 15 to 18 tons per acre, with normal prices ranging from \$15 to \$35 per ton, and finds a ready market. In recent years from 6,000 to 7,000 tons have been grown annually.

In addition to tomatoes and onions, much of the land is equally well suited for production of hay; alfalfa, yielding three crops per season; corn, an important silo crop; white beans; potatoes and all kinds of vegetables, including citron, squash, musk-melons, carrots, pumpkins, cucumbers and rhubarb.

There are also large tracts of grazing land which afford good pasturage for the rapidly increasing herds of horses and cattle. Ranchers and cattlemen have not been slow to recognize the ideal conditions which exist for ranging live stock, and importations of the choicest animals are being continually made through the Stockbreeders' Association to the still greater benefit of existing herds.
