Rev. Father Burke, a learned and holy priest of the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer, died at New Orleans on the 21st inst. He had long been in ill health. The Society of Jesus in the United States has sustained another great loss in the death of Rev. Father McDonough the worthy Vice-President of Woodstock College, Md. GOOD OFF OF EVIL.—The Episcopal Bishop of Georgia, invited by the successful labors of Rev. Father McCabe, New York, in making converts, lately delivered a sermon in which he attacked the Church which the Reverend Father was not slow in replying to. In an able lecture, he defended the explained Catholic doctrine so satisfactorily to the large audience of Protestants that many of them are now under instruction for Baptism.

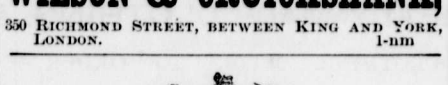

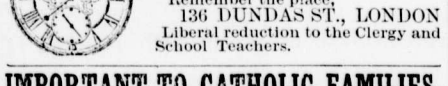
