The Order of the Day for the second reading of the Bill to amend the Acts incorporating the Canada Central Railway Company, being read;
And the Question being put, That the Bill be now read a second time; the House divided: And it was resolved in the Affirmative.

The Bill was accordingly read a second time; and referred to the Standing Committee on Railways, Canals and Telegraph Lines.

The Order of the Day for the second reading of the Bill to authorize the construction of a Railway from the Niagara to the Detriot Rivers, being read.

And the Question being proposed, That the Bill be now read a second time :

And a Debate arising thereupon; Mr. Mackenzie moved, seconded by Mr. McKellar, and the Question being put, That the Debate be adjourned; the House divided: And it was resolved in the Affirmative.

The Order of the Day for the second reading of the Bill for establishing the boundary lines between certain Ranges in the Township of Onslow, being read;

The Bill was accordingly read a second time; and referred to the Standing Committee

on Miscellancous Private Bills.

The Clerk of the Legislative Council delivered, at the Bar of the House, the following

Message :-

The Legislative Council have passed the Bill, intituled, "An Act to incorporate the Canadian Rubber Company of Montreal, or La Compagnié Canadienne de Caoutchouc de Montréal," with several amendments, to which they desire the concurrence of this House. And then he withdrew.

The House proceeded to take into consideration the amendments made by the Legislative Council to the Bill, intituled, "An Act to incorporate the Canadian Rubber Com-"pany of Montreal, or, "La Compagnié Canadienne de Caoutchouc de Montréal," and the same were read, as follow:-
