## LITERARY NOTES

In Acadia Library we are often asked for a lecture suitable for reading aloud in public. I know of no thing that would delight the average Canadian audience more than the various stories in "Mastered Men", by F. A. Robinson, B. A., a book published in Canada by McClelland & Stewart. They are vivid in their portrayal of the savage, half brutal life of men in the West who have shaken off the trammels of convention and even of decency. To minister unto such men in holy things is the task that confronts the Western preacher. I believe that the stories in "Mastered Men" are largely true, and are taken from the author's personal experience. The introduction is by Rev. Charles W. Gordon, or Ralph Connor, as we love to call him. I quote this paragraph: "The new west is full of the broken driftwood of humanity, showing the marks of the attrition of time and conflict and defeat—good stuff it is, but waste and loss. This book tells of its salvage to the infinite joy of men and the glory of God. The book will do good wherever it goes."

From the Musson Book Company I have received a copy of that most attractive edition of Longfellow's "Evangeline", with the introduction written by Mr. John Frederic Herbin of our own town. Now, I think every Nova Scotian really needs a copy of this "Evangeline". It matters not how many editions of Longfellow you have; if you are at all interested in the historic associations of your native land you will have this one. Mr. Herbin has gathered his facts from unique sources, and has infused into his sketch of the Evangeline country that sympathetic quality that marks the man of genuine literary gifts from the mere raconteur. ## AMATEUR CLUBS ONE OF FINEST RESULTS OF RADIO

One of the encouraging symptoms of recent development in radio has been the gradual merging of the "amateur" and the "public" group.

There can be no doubt that at first there was some hostility between the two, the former resenting the intrusion of his new and unexpected host into his field, and the latter heatedly objecting to the interference often caused by various buzzer conversations. Incidentally, the latter were very often attributed unfairly to the amateur.

However, there can be no doubt that the hostile attitude has softened all along the line. And the chief cause of this new understanding has been the radio club.

The latter has grown from a half dozen, on very large communities, to hundreds in the last few months, their growth representing the development of the "fans" into ardent amateurs, from listeners into investigators. Many young people who have never heard of radio a few months ago are now active members of clubs alongside those who have been occupied with citizen radio for years, and the combination has not only smoothed out many of the original jealousies, but it has made intelligent young recruits out of the newcomers.

Radio has in this instance capitalized the gang spirit in the interests of a great, healthy cause, and established a splendid esprit de corps among a fine element in the community having a common interest. No development that has followed in its train is more auspicious than the growth of the radio clubs.
