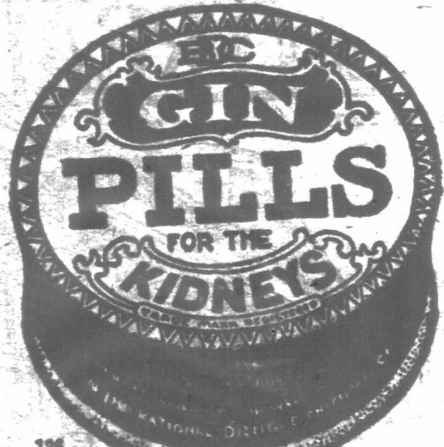




READ HER LETTER

Letter from New Denmark Soldier

A Canadian Soldier, son of the late Carl O. Hanson of New Denmark writes a letter to his sister which reads as follows:

Somewhere in France
Dear Sister, Annie: You'll think I have forgotten you since coming over here, but its so difficult to find something to write to all of you at home and I always try to write mother every week. Often times we have to do our writing under very difficult conditions. It is seldom we have the chance of sitting at a table, nearly always we have to write on our knees and sit on the ground. But you know through mother's letters, I am well and doing fine, as the old saying is. Well, you read about the war in the papers and I can say no more than what you see there. While in England as you know I went on a trip to Scotland and was in Edinburgh and Glasgow and enjoyed the trip very much, especially my stay in Edinburgh which is a good deal like a Canadian city in many ways, and the people treated us very nice. It only cost a halfpenny to ride on the car (one cent) so that is pretty cheap. I didn't care much for London, but I visited many places of interest there. I was also in the House of Parliament which was in session at the time and I had the pleasure of seeing quite a few of the members you read so much about in the papers. But I wrote to mother about this so you likely read it in her letter. England is a beautiful country with its many trees and green fields in summer but the rural districts are so lonesome looking. France is a good deal like England only it cannot compare with either England or Scotland. There is a lot of farming done in this country, more than one would imagine, and every bit of available land is used. Its surprising how the women have to work in this country. They do practically all the work while the men are away fighting. France has done wonderfully in this war and deserves great credit. She was not so easy a mark as Germany thought. Belgium is much the same as France, but of course, it appears, Canadians are not likely to forget Belgium. It holds so many of our boys who will never return again. No one can understand what they went through at Ypres and how well they fought. If they had all fought as well as the Canadians and the British Tommies the war would have been over now. It will be a great blessing when the awful struggle is over, it does not look promising now considering Italy, however, it may come coming to this unit, but have seen enough and its a hard life to go through, but as long as a person has "hope and courage," he is not down and out and tho' at times the clouds are dark and one's spirits low, when it seems as if the end of this sad business will never come, yet there is always some little spark of hope left in a person's heart that gives him energy and confidence in his daily task.

It is very muddy here at this time and hardly a day it does not rain and the weather is beginning to be so wintry, its pretty hard to keep ones clothes dry and ones

self in good shape. It requires the best of health to stand against the conditions one is subject to here, you would think so, if you could see the boys at times, when they come out of the trenches, etc, covered with mud and their steel helmets drawn down so close and flat on their heads and all having the same set expression of endurance in their faces, but just the same, behind all is a smile and the sign of self sacrifice. It is a wonderful sight when our guns open, especially at night. It fairly shakes the ground for miles and is one continual roar, and the flashes from the gun remind you of lightning. Overhead shells go whistling through the air over to the Huns and they know the effect of our shells only too well. At places the ground is turned upside down by shell holes and big trees are torn to pieces, so you see nothing can stand against the big guns. I have seen some of the U.S. soldiers and they look good. It brightens up a fellow a bit to know they are coming and its not likely to be long before they will be taking an important part in this war on this side of the ocean. It was certainly good to see the U.S. nurses which happened to be my pleasure about two or three months ago. There were quite a few of them and they looked almost like angels in the crowd on the streets and among the soldiers and French people. They are just like our own Canadian nurses. By the time you get this letter it will be Christmas. Its no use for me wishing to be among you so I try not to think about such things. Glad you are doing so well at school this year when ever I come home again I am coming to visit you all and stay a good while too. You ought to be reading pretty good news in the papers. I received your letter some time during the summer and was certainly glad to get it. I have forgotten Christine's address, but I must send her a card for Christmas. Well I am not so badly off at present and we

have to make the best of it, and am very fortunate, considering everything. Well goodbye for this time, wishing you all a merry Christmas and happiness throughout the coming year. Your Brother
