Being prevented by quarantine from attending the meeting of the council, we beg to send the list of officers for the parish of Rogersville for the ensuing year for approval.

Also we desire to express our opinion with regard to matters concerning the so-called smallpox in Rogersville. We are not competeut to decide whether it is the genuipe smallpox or not; the board of health is responsible for that. We know, however, that the same disease existed here a year ago in several bouses, and also last fall in several families and died out of itfelf without quarantine or any 12.
