Coun. Connors said that the outbreak of Small pox occurred at Rogersville some money was wanted and as many members of the council as could be reached were asked to sign an order on the treasurer for \$150.00 and that amount was obtained.

The report was adopted and bills ordered to be paid.

Coun. Anderson asked Sec. Treasurer if the incorporated towns of Newcastle and Chatham were exempt from paying their portion of the bills of Board of Health.

Sec. Treasurer.—I am not at present prepared to say what is the liability of the towns in this matter. Perhaps Coun. Watt, who is conversant on such matters could give us some information.

Coun. Murray thought that incorporated towns would not be liable, especially in this case as they had not been touched by the epidemic. But they will contribute their part as they are already assessed for county purposes.

Coun. Anderson said that was what he wanted to know.

Coun. Watt presumed the Sec. Treasurer would look into law and advise the council.

On motion of Coun. Ryan the council adjourned until 10 o'clock Thursday morning.

**THURSDAY.**

The Warden called council to order at ten o'clock, a. m.

Coun. Flett took his seat.

The Warden read the following: To the Warden of the Municipality of Northumberland.

Being prevented by quarantine from attending the meeting of the council, we beg to send the list of officers for the parish of Rogersville for the ensuing year for approval.

Also we desire to express our opinion with regard to matters concerning the so-called smallpox in Rogersville. We are not competent to decide whether it is the genuine smallpox or not; the board of health is responsible for that. We know, however, that the same disease existed here a year ago in several houses, and also last fall in several families and died out of itself without quarantine or any extraordinary precautions. We feel that unnecessary expenses were made in Rogersville regarding this matter.

1st The renting of a house to serve as an hospital and the furnishing of it proved useless, as no one ever occupied it.

2nd The appointment of a nurse was unequalled for, as every family could well have attended the sick members of the family without him; in fact, it was a great danger of spreading the disease going from house to house visiting and meeting the travelling public on the public highway. The doctor in charge could well have filled the wants of the sick without a nurse.

3rd The expenses incurred in connection with the quarantine of Dr. Bourret, his family and Jacques Poirier's family, were in our opinion unnecessary and unjustifiable, if not illegal. The appointment of three special constables to watch that house for twenty days, not one member of the Board nor their advisor having once visited that house or inquired of their wants for that space of time, seems to us an act of special cruelty which we cannot allow to pass without a protest.

4th The expenses incurred with regard to the quarantine of Aime Martin and Pierre Goguen require to be investigated.

5th The general treatment, ways and means of officers and the employees would also require attention and investigation.

6th The fact of a new case of the disease at Henry Bourque's camp at his mill should be thoroughly looked into. About two months ago in the same camp a young man was discovered infected with what was pronounced a bad case of smallpox. After three days of sickness when the rash was out he was allowed to walk five or six miles to his father's house on the public highway. The camp was quarantined and we


