### Canada's New Premier.

HON. ARTHUR MEIGHEN.

The man whom Sir Wilfrid Laurier described seven years ago as the “brightest mind in the Conservative Party” is now Canada's Prime Minister.

The Hon. Arthur Meighen is the first Westerner and the youngest Premier Canada has had. He is described as a Westerner, for, although he was born in Ontario he went west at an early age, and it is in Manitoba that he built up his career.

The new Premier is only forty-four years of age. Sir John Thompson was forty-eight when he succeeded Sir John Abbott. Hon. Alexander Mackenzie was fifty-one when he became Prime Minister; Sir John Macdonald, fifty-two; Sir Wilfrid Laurier, fifty-five; Sir Robert Borden, fifty-seven; Sir Mackenzie Bowell, seventy; Sir John Abbott, seventy-one and Sir Charles Tupper, seventy-five.

Born on 16th June, at Anderson, Blanshard Township, Perth County, Ont., Arthur Meighen was educated at St. Mary's Collegiate Institute and at Toronto University. He graduated in 1896 with the degree of Bachelor of Arts winning honors in mathematics. For two years he taught school at Caledonia, Ont., and then went to Winnipeg where he used the teaching profession as a stepping stone to law.

In 1903 he was called to the Manitoba Bar and began the practice of his profession in Portage la Prairie. He soon won success as a criminal lawyer, showing evidences of possessing a remarkable clearness of mind, and was created a Bencher of the Manitoba Law Society in 1908, becoming a member of the Upper Canada Law Society in 1914.

Returned as a Conservative for Portage la Prairie in 1908 Arthur Meighen's rise in Parliament was very rapid. It is said that after hearing the new member's first speech Sir Wilfrid Laurier remarked, “Borden has found a man.”

Nine years after he had been first elected to Parliament Arthur Meighen had held five important offices. He was appointed Solicitor-General of Canada on June 26, 1913. He was sworn as a member of the King's Privy Council for Canada on September 30, 1915. He became Secretary of State for Canada and Minister of Mines on August 23, 1917, and was sworn in as Minister of the Interior and Superintendent-General of Indian Affairs on October 2, 1917, on the formation of the Union Government. He was again elected for Portage la Prairie at the general election of December 17, 1917.

Mr. Meighen was one of the Cabinet Ministers who accompanied the Right Hon. Sir Robert Borden to England to attend the last Imperial Conference.

In debate the new Premier proved himself particularly strong in attack, with a biting sarcasm. His mental processes appear to be extremely rapid but very logical, which is only natural when it is borne in mind that he was particularly brilliant at mathematics when at College.

Fifteen years ago Arthur Meighen married Miss Jessie Isabel Cox of Birtle, Man., daughter of the late Charles Cox of Granby, Quebec. Miss Cox was a teacher in the public school at Portage la Prairie when she met the Premier who was a Collegiate teacher.

Their eldest boy is farming in Manitoba, while the other boy and girl are attending school in Ottawa. Mrs. Meighen has been described as being devoted to her husband, her home and her children, and as little caring for those semi-public activities in which wives of public men indulge in Ottawa.

### Quebec's New Premier.

The Hon. Louis Alexander Taschereau, the new Premier of Quebec and the Dominion of Canada, are of like age, for both began life in 1867—fifty-three years ago.

Both on the paternal and the maternal side Mr. Taschereau belongs to distinguished lines. To the bar and the bench, to the church and to public life the Taschereau family has given several eminent men. The new Premier's father was the Hon. Mr. Justice Taschereau, and his mother was Josephine Caron, daughter of the late Hon. R. E. Caron, for a number of years a Justice of the Superior Court of Quebec, and later Lieutenant-Governor of the Province.

Laval University is Mr. Taschereau's alma mater, and law is his profession. He began practice as a junior in the firm headed by Sir Charles

Fitzpatrick, the present Lieutenant-Governor. The former junior partner is now his former leader's chief constitutional adviser.

Mr. Taschereau entered public life in 1900, when he was elected to the Assembly where his ability and gift of speech soon brought him to the front. Seven years after entering the House he was invited by Sir Lomer Gouin to join the ministry and so he became Minister of Public Works and Labor, retaining the portfolio until a short time ago when he relieved the Premier of the portfolio of Attorney-General. He also served the city of Quebec as alderman, and was also Batonnier of the Bar of the District of Quebec. In 1891 Mr. Taschereau married a

daughter of the Hon. Elisee Dionne, member of the Legislative Council. Their family consists of three sons and two daughters.

Mr. Taschereau has entered upon the Premiership under most favorable conditions. In both branches of the Legislative his government has the support of the majority of the members; the finances of the Province are in a sound condition, and prosperity prevails in every walk of life.
