EIGHTH DAY.
Ottawa, Sept. 13.

The Commission met to-day at 11 a.m., and, as usual, the first business was the reading and correction of the evidence, and its signature by the witnesses, which occupied the greater portion of the sitting.

Mr. Hamel, a Quebec merchant, was then called, but knew nothing whatever of the matter under enquiry.

The name of Mr. E. R. Burpee was called; no one answered the call, however, and Mr. Burpee was entered as in default.

No further testimony was taken, and the Commission then adjourned till 4 p.m., for the closing and signature of the depositions of Mr. Hamel and Hon. Senator Chapais.
