Sale of Obito's Ranch Marks End Beresford's Strange Career in S. W.

El Paso, Texas, April 29.-The sale of the Ojitos ranch in Mexico for \$190,-000 wound up the affairs of the estate of the late Lord Delaval Beresford, who chose to spend his life on a cattle ranch of 110,000 acres in Mexico, his companion, a negro woman, rather than

Delaval Beresford left England wher a young man, twenty years or more ago, because he did not like the restraints of the life he had been accustomed to. He wandered until he found a location that suited him. It was leagues from the railroad, in the mountain fastness of the then almost unexplored stretches of northern Chihuahua, in Mexico. Why he went there and why he selected this loeation for his home he told nobody. He had money to buy the land, which was worth less than 50 cents an acre, and he had the money to buy the cattle with which to stock it.

He was rough and ready, as the cow boys say. He was an Englishman but he did not have the English ways. He was ready to ride with the hardlest vaquero, and at night would sleep with nothing but mother earth for a bed and only his saddletree for a pillow. That he was a lord, a member of the British aristocracy, nobody knew for years, but he was admired as an Engshman with nerve and grit.

"Bought' for El Paso. Whether his relatives knew where he was nobody knew. He never seemed get any mail and he never wrote any but business letters. He made friends of his Mexican vaqueros and their families, and he became known in El Paso, for he made visits every once and a while to the city, and it did not take long for the people to become sware when he was there. On these visits he treated everybody

During the revelry the negress, known to her associates as Flo; announced that she was Lady Flo and that she was the wife of Lord Delaval Beresford, brother of the English Admiral Charles Beresford. "We's gwine back to old Englan' and I'se gwine to

cause I'se de wife of a lord," she would everybody soon spoke of the couple as "Lord and Lady Flo." The Englishman continued to raise cattle and ship them to Canada and sell them for a good price, and accompanied by plack companion he made regular trips to El Paso. He never denied the statements of the negress that she was his wife and she made purchases at the stores and charged them to Lord Beresford, who always settled the bills promptly. No more letters passed between the Englishman and his family back in England than before the disclosure of his identity, however, and "Lady Flo" never made her trip to see


