The Canadas.

The Earl of Mountcashel said that, with the permission of the Government, he had to put a question on a subject of very considerable importance to a large class of emigrants who had gone out to Canada. It was well known that in the course of the last and present year, very considerable numbers amounting to 6,000 emigrants, had crossed from the United States into Canada. Most of these were paupers, who had gone out as emigrants, and who, owing to the state of difficulties of that country, were unable to obtain employment. These, let it be borne in mind, were in addition to 16,000 or 17,000 poor persons who were already in the Canadas, for the greater part without employment. In 1841 a sum of money was proposed to be raised, by way of a loan, for the purpose of carrying on public works in Canada; and Lord Sydenham who was then governor announced to the House of Assembly that Her Majesty's gov-House of Assembly that Her Majesty's government would call on the Imperial Parliament to give aid to the local Government .-He hoped that the present government, tho'h he would admit that they were not the acts by the acts of their predecesors, wol'd gurantee the loan for the sake of carrying on gurantee the loan for the sake of carrying on the were were otherwise unable to procure work.
