HOMELESS HEBREWS.

from Russia and Drives from the Austrian Border.

ODESSA, April 28.—Jewish families have been ordered to quit Kieff. The well-to-do have already gone, but the poor artisan classes are in the greatest distress. Many arrived on the Austrian frontier in a destitute condition, but the Austrian officials refused to admit them. The police accept no excuse, raiding the city with the utmost severity. The daily expulsions from Moscow number from 100 to 150. On Sunday 690 were expelled. The rigor of the authorities frightens away many who are suited to permanent residence. The emistration of Jewish people from this city has quadrupled. Permits guaranteed by the Minister of Foreign Affairs, the Minister of Finance and the Minister of the Interior, anyone of whom has power to quash their renor, are considered of doubtful value, and the principals of large Jewish firms are placing their business in the larges of Russian agents and are themish firms are placing their business in the hands of Russian agents and are them-

London, April 28.—The Pall Mall Cazette gives prominence to a scheme said to have been drafted to transport Hebrews from Poland and the southeast of Europe to an immense tract of uninhabited land in Australia or Brazil. Baron Hirsch is credited with having originated this idea and having decided to give 15,000,000 and the start the project.
