Mackenzie Bowell, to be present at a proposed luncheon at Ottawa to a large delegation of prominent colonists. The party is making a tour of the country, and intends visiting Toronto and Hamilton. If a trip west is taken the strangers will be cordially invited to stop over at London. Should they comply the Board of Trade will show them around the city and entertain them as only Londoners can. Postoffice Inspector Barker, of Toronto, acknowledged in kind words the copy of the resolution passed at the annual board meeting, expressing regret at his removal from the city and appreciation of his valuable assistance while connected with the board here. Mr. Bland reported that he had seen Sir John Carling, and was given the assurance that the alterations to the postoffice, for which the board have been asking for two years, were soon to be made. A communication from the manager of Commerce, a weekly trade journal published in London, Eng., relative to subscription was referred to the council of the board. Mr. T. E. Mara was unanimously elected a member. No discussions arose under new business, and Mr. John Cameron suggested that at the next quarterly meeting in September papers be prepared on some special subjects, which would give rise to a useful and helpful debate.
