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THE ONTARIO LEGISLATURE.

Estimated Expenditure for 1902 Is \$4,004,228.32.

Among Appropriations Is the Sum of \$23,295 for the London Asylum—Budget Speech Tomorrow.

Toronto, Jan. 20.—The provincial estimates for the current year and the public accounts for 1901 were laid on the table of the legislature today by Premier Ross. The estimated expenditure for 1902 is \$4,004,228.32, as follows:

The actual expenditure last year was \$4,038,244.49. The ordinary expenditures aggregated \$4,038,244.49, thus showing a surplus on the one year's operations, there has been an unusual addition to railway debt. The grants to railways increase the obligations, which are met by railway certificates and annuities.

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STILL SPREADING

Ontario Health Authorities Report New Cases—Michigan Doctors Deceived.

Toronto, Jan. 20.—Several new cases of smallpox were reported today to Dr. Bryce, provincial medical health officer. Two distinct outbreaks have been reported from Sault Ste. Marie, one of which was from the United States side. Another bunch of cases has been reported from Castlemaine, in Russell county. The disease has also broken out in the vicinity of Victoria Mines, west of Sudbury.

Scarlatina is epidemic in Parry Sound. Three deaths have occurred in one family in the vicinity of a lumber camp.

In Little Current, Manitoulin, they are having a great deal of typhoid, supposed to be from the bad water.

SMALLPOX IN THE WEST.

Winnipeg, Jan. 21.—At Morris, on Sunday, a smallpox patient was quarantined in a car, which was side-tracked.

Vancouver, B. C., Jan. 21.—A case of smallpox has developed in the family of Fred Shirley, at Nelson, B. C.

No cases of smallpox were held in Fernie, B. C., on Sunday owing to quarantine measures on account of smallpox.

DOCTORS DECEIVED.

Lansing, Mich., Jan. 20.—It is very apparent that Miss Effie Parham, the University of Michigan sophomore, who has developed a case of smallpox, contracted the disease at her home in Bronson, where the physicians have been treating a number of cases as chickenpox.

INFECTED BY A KISS.

While Miss Parham was home during the holidays she attended a wedding, where she kissed one of the guests, a lady from California, whose face showed an eruption. This woman has left Bronson, and her present whereabouts are unknown. In view of the erroneous diagnosis of the Bronson cases, it is feared that the outbreak will cause much trouble.

THE BUDGET.

Premier Ross intimated that the motion to go into supply would be the first order on Wednesday.

Mr. Matheson complained that it was short notice. "The only disadvantage is personally to myself," he said, "and those who have to speak. They have to sit up two or three nights, while the minister, with a staff of clerks behind him, is in a position to prepare himself in a few minutes. There should be at least three or four days between the receipt of the estimates and public accounts and the budget speech."

"Things will be brief and clear," said the premier.

THE ASSESSMENT BILL.

Mr. Whitney asked if the premier could inform the house of the progress of the assessment bill. It was commonly rumored that the bill had been reported by the assessment commission.

The premier replied that no bill had been reported by the commission. He expected that this week or early next week the report of the assessment commission would be laid on the table. There would be no bill from the commission as to any particular phase of assessment, but a government bill on the question of assessment would be down within a reasonable time.

MOTIONS AND PETITIONS.

Mr. Hoyle asked for an order of the house showing the amount received from private parties toward the support of relatives and others in the insane asylums of the province.

The provincial secretary promised him information.

Among the petitions presented was one from E. G. Rumball, C. H. Furdum, Thomas C. Knott, A. E. Welch, T. H. Luskomb and O'Brien O'Donnell, London, R. McQueen, of Westminster, and James Bowen, of Westmount, for incorporation as the London Railway Company, with power to construct lines from London to Delaware, Gloucester and Stratford, on the west, and as far east as Hamilton, with radial extension from any point.

The Aylmer, St. Thomas and London Electric Railway Company are also asking incorporation.
