MORE GERMANS ON THE WESTERN FRONT THAN EVER BEFORE

Gen. Maurice Says They Have Not Been Removed.

Sees Big Dangers Everywhere.

LONDON, Oct. 26 .- The idea that German effectives have been removed from the western front for duty else-Gen. F. B. Maurice, chief director of military operations at the war office, in an interview today.

"There are more German divisions on the western front today than ever," he

The slowing down of the British offensive on the Somme front has been entirely due to weather conditions, Gen. Maurice explained.

"Despite the minor importance of the British operations during the past fortnight," said he, "you must notice that the German official communiques frequently states that heavy attacks have been repulsed. Such statements are purely imaginary.

Losses Are Minimum. "Our operations, while destined to mprove our positions, have been accomlished with minimum losses to our elves, while inflicting the heaviest posble losses on the Germans

"Our chief operation was the oc pation of the brow of the ridge extendng from Le Sars to Thiepval, which was dominated by the Schwaben redoubt. 
