Sandon, Dec. 20.—Mining during the past year in the Slocan has been on the increase, owing to the very low advanced prices of everything used in mining.

The tonnage for the past year for the Slocan and Slocan City mining divisions will amount to about 26,000 tons, being about the same as last year, but when it is considered that only one-third of this tonnage was contributed from the Slocan, it is evident that the Slocan Mining division has certainly decreased in output, and at present time of writing only about 300 men were working in the Slocan.
