That the rules for transportation of dead bodies submitted by the Montreal Association of Baggage Agents are in accord with the views of sanitarians and are calculated to prevent the spread of contagious diseases.

That in the opinion of this board it is desirable that the practice of transporting the bodies of persons dead from dangerous communicable diseases be discontinued owing to the impossibility of at all times preventing persons who may have been infected owing to their contact with corpse, sick room, or persons who have been in contact with the sick.

Solong, however, as dead bodies are transmitted by rail we would recommend that the following in addition to those included in rule I, be absolutely forbidden, viz.: Diphtheria, anthrax, scarlet fever, measies and puerperal fever.
