Booth Anticipated.

While General Booth and Commissioner Smith are disputing authorship of a "Circular Letter," which was written by The New York Churchman or one of them both of the laurels. He relates how his plan was overruled 100 years ago. Count von Moltke, who had been Minister of War of Prussia, and subsequently became Lieutenant-General of the Bavarian army. It seems he gave each soldier a plot of ground for gathering purposes, without having to wait till the end of the year. The scheme was divided into sixteen districts, and over each was placed a man, who presided at a church service, physician, priest and apothecary. Jan. 1, 1900, the military surrounded the city and 7000 paupers were arrested and put in prison immense cloth factory prepared for the winter. The soldiers' barracks were made cloth days. Those unable to work were well cared for—those able worked hard to do so. The scheme worked very successfully, and its good effects remain to this day.

General Booth might refer the British public to the success of the German scheme and proof of its practicability.
