## THE ANNUAL EXAMINATION - FOR MATRICULATION, AND FOR SCHOLARSHIPS, will commence on Tuesday, ()ctober 1st, 1861.

The following Schorarsuips will be open to competition:-
Four Foundation Scholarsuips, tenable for three Fears, riz.,-One of $£ 30$ currency per annum ; one of $£ 25$; and two of $£ 20$.
The holders of these Scholarships will be required to attend Lectures and Examinations in the Arts course.

All persons presenting themselves for examination must produce testimonials of good conduct. Candidates for Matriculation must have entered on their sixteenth, and Candidates for Scholarships on their seventeenth year.

The subjects of examination may be learned by appliostion to the Provost of Trinity College, who will furnish any other information which may be required.
One Weinington Scholansimp, of the annual value of $£ 50$ currency, tenable for two years; and one Beraside, one Allan, and one Dicrson SchoLARSHip, each of the annual value of $£ 30$ curreucy, and tenable for three years, will be a warded to Students commencing their College Course in October next, according to the result of the yearly examination in the following June.
In lieu of the Four Church Society Scholarships, annually awarded to Students for Holy Orders, it is proposed to substitute Exhibitions, of which the particulars will be made known, when the scheme is matured.
One Jubilee Scholarship, of the annual value of $£ 40$ currency, and tenable for two years, is open annually to the most deserving Bachelor of the year, who, having graduated in Honours, shall have expressed his intention of studying
for Holy Orders.
