That the principal industry of the city of Quebec is that of shipbuilding, which is now in a very depressed tate, and the arlicans and labourers connected therewith amost totally deprived of employment, for want of new markets for shippers.

Your p-stitioners therefore humbly pray, that no Treaty of Reciprocity be concluded without a provision giving the vessels built or owned in the Dominion of Canada the right of registration in the United States, as is now enjoyed by the vessels of that nation in all the ports of the British Empire.

And your petitioners, as in duty bound, will over pray.
