"Even if emigrants were to settle in Canada in large numbers, their presence might prove sovie'idal to the highest interests of her free institutions."

One of the debaters evidently fostered the belief "that the son erus tones of a previous sentimental speaker were jest a little surpassed" by his own.

Let Ixion stay revolving on his wheel: Let Tantalus reachaster grapes in vain; Let wickedness all kinds of torture feel. But now let meanness feel deserved pain. Let any man who marks so near first class Be tied to a large comet as his fate And may the comet swiftly Wolfville pass, And not return till 1898.
