Again: "No one can mix with Canadians on land or sea without being struck by their deep-seated attachment to the Old Land and its institutions and their rooted determination to hold fast to their Imperial inheritance." Mr. Hogan's is not a pretentious book, but the style is pleasant, and the circulation of his book in Britain will do this country good. Nor is it without a lively interest for Canadians.

TALE OF A LONELY PARISH By F. Marion Crowford. Paper, 50c. Macmillan & Co., New York; Copp.

Mr. Crawford, as we know, can present as striking a tale of American life as when his characters and the setting of his stories are wholly foreign. This is a picture of English social life, where Mr. Crawford seems equally at home. It abounds with evidences of the author's scholarly tastes and power of delineating character. The story leaves a pleasant impression, perhaps because the curtain falls on peace and happiness distributed all round.

THE AMAZING MARRIAGE. By George Meredith. Boards Colonial Edition. Copp. Clark Co., Ltd., Toronto: Geo Bell & Son, London,

English aristocratic society furnishes the material for this book. Mr. Meredith draws his characters with power, and they are never mere walking ladies and gentlemen, but distinctive types. Take this: "Sir Meeson Corby was a plump little beau of forty, at war with his fat and accounting his tight blue tail coat and brass buttous a victory. His tightness made his fatness elastic: he looked wound up for a dance, and could hardly hold on a leg," and so on. The author's books ought to do well in this country if we follow the judgment of the English critics, who award him so high a place in current fiction.

THE HEART OF LIFE. By W. H. Mallock, Boards. Colonial Library Copp. Clarl Co., Toronto : Geo. Bell & Son, London.

This, too, is an English society story with a good deal of clever dialogue, pleasant description and some analysis of the emotions. We are introduced to very exalted company, and get to like it, if one could only believe that peers and peeresses were as interesting collectively as they appear in this book. The spice of politics in the story improves it, and the culmination is vivid and engrossing.
