#### Commercial Summary.

A HALF-YEARLY dividend of four per cent has been declared by the Bank of Nova Scotia.

THE Emerson, Man., branch of the Ontario Bank is about to be closed.

Mr. M. A. Pennington of Hamilton, Ont., insurance and real estate agent, wishes us to mention that he is not connected with the firm of Pennington & Co., referred to last week as " M. A. Pennington & Co."

lr is reported that Messrs. J. W. Rapley, of Kincardine, Jas. Manson, of Strathroy, and Fred J. Winlow, of the Federal Bank, London, have formed a partnership for the purpose of establishing and carrying on a general banking business at Durliam.

EDOUARD ROULLARD, sen., grocer, Pierreville, Que, recently assigned in trust. He was formerly a waggon-maker, and after saving some money was induced to embark in business three or four years ago, for the benefit of his two sons, neither of whom had any experience. It is simply the old story of the shoemaker and his last.

THE estate of Mr. Arthur Lefaivre, grocer, this city, who assigned in trust last month, has been sold out, the store stock bringing 70c on the dollar, rolling stock 60r, and book-debts 40c. The creditors will probably realize about 25c on the dollar. There was a deficiency of \$1,000, on liabilities of \$4,000 .- The grocery estate of G. Letaivre & Co., also of this city, has been sold by tender.

THE boiler-feeder known as the "Patent Exhaust Injector" has been creating considerable interest for some time among steam-users, from the fact that it economizes the exhaust steam-an obvious advantage. The licensee of the patent for this Dominion has at last arranged here for the manufacture and distribution of these Injectors, and appointed Messrs. John Taylor & Brother of this city sole agents for the Province of Quebec and some adjoining territory.
