HONOR TO WHOM HONOR IS DUE,
OR SOME ACCOUNT OF THE MERITORIOUS SERVICES OF THE
LATE JEAN BAPTISTE DUBERGER, SENR.

JEAN BAPTISTE DUBERGER (or, as he usually signed himself, *John Baptist Duberger*) was born at Detroit on February 17th, 1767. When quite young he was sent by his friends to Quebec, furnished with money enough, in the form of pieces of silver, to pay his expenses down, and to secure his admission as a resident-scholar in the Seminary of Quebec. If, as is supposed, he was then about 15 years of age, he must have spent, subsequently, about seven years in that institution; for, in his 23rd year, having given evidence of mechanical genius and of aptitude in the art of drawing, he was taken into the service of the R. E. Department, on the staff of which he continued to be employed during the remainder of his life.

In official documents we find Duberger styled "Mr. Duberger, of the first class of Royal Military Surveyors, and Draftsman."
