Squatters Upon School Lands in Manitoba.

NOTICE is hereby given that under the Act of the Parliament of canada 56 Victoria chapter 18, passed in the year 1893, it is provided that certain persons therein n med, who were in bona fide occupation of school Lands prior to the 18t of January, 1896, and who have since that date continued to occupations of the Dominion Lands Act, should be permitted to make homestead entry therefor. It is alleged, however, that the persons thus named do not comprise all who by virtue of the occupation which that Act recognizes are entitled to the same consideration, and this notice is therefore given calling upon all persons who were residing upon School Lands within the Province of Manitoba prior to the 1st of January, 1883, and have since continued to occupy and cultivate such lands in accordance with the requirements of the homestead provisions of the Dominion Lands Act, whose names do not appear in the said Act, to file their claims with the commissioner of Dominion Lands, Winnipeg, on or before the 15th day of March Winnipeg, on or before the 1sth day of March 1895, the intention being to ask for legislation enabling the Department of the Interior to examine and deal with all claims arising out of such occupation as the said Act describes which may be filed in accordance with the terms of this notice on or before the 15th day of March, 1895. 
