What is considered in the assessment of proposals?

Proposals requesting financial assistance from TIP are assessed on the following:

- potential to acquire the technical skills and knowledge necessary to develop or produce new or improved products or processes in Canada;
- potential to produce an economic benefit for Canada;
- the capability of the applicants to utilize the technology or adapt it to Canadian requirements;
- the uniqueness of the technology in Canada.

Who can apply?

Requests for identification of foreign technology sources [TIP Post Services] and proposals for financial support [TIP Fund] are invited from individuals or organizations in the private sector, as well as from provincial governments, universities, and federal departments or agencies. Non-federal government applicants should arrange for sponsorship of their proposals for financial support by a federal department or agency that has an interest in the proposed activity. The sponsor must provide an assessment of the proposal's technical merit and its potential to obtain technology that will produce an economic benefit for Canada.
