McDOUGALL PAYS TRIBUTE TO INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY

On the occasion of International Women's Day, March 8, 1992, the Secretary of State for External Affairs, the Honourable Barbara McDougall, pays tribute to the role and contribution of women worldwide to global development and peace.

"Canada remains unequivocally committed to the advancement of women and will continue to play a leading role in international forums to achieve political, economic and social equality for women," the Minister said.

Mrs. McDougall cited a number of Canadian initiatives over the past year to enhance the global status of women:

- Conference on Security and Co-operation in Europe Canada secured new commitments to women's equality at
 - the Moscow Conference on Human Dimensions (September 1991).
- Commonwealth Commonwealth leaders endorsed a Canadian-initiated Declaration on Women and Structural Adjustment at the Harare Heads of Government Meeting (October 1991). The Declaration is aimed at promoting economic equality for women by ensuring that they do not suffer disproportionately from structural adjustment measures.
- La Francophonie Prime Minister Mulroney announced at the Summit in Chaillot (November 1991) that Canada would sponsor the establishment of a network of legal aid centres to meet the needs of women in countries of La Francophonie.
