II. And it is hereby further enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That the faid rates and duties, charged by this Act, fhall be deemed, and are hereby declared to be, Sterling money of Great Britain; and shall be collected, recovered, and paid, to the Amount of the value of which fuch nominal fums bear in Great Britain, and that fuch monies may be received and taken according to the proportion and value of five fhillings and fixpence the ounce in Silver; and that the faid duties, herein-before granted shall be raifed, levied, collected, paid, and recovered, in the fame manner and form, and by fuch rules, ways, and means, and under fuch penalties and forfeitures, except in fuch cafes where any alteration is made by this Act, as any other duties payable to His Majefly upon goods imported into any Britith Colony or Plantation in America, are or fhall be railed, levied, collected, paid, and recovered, by any Act or Acts of Parliament, as fully and effectually, to all intents and purpofes, as if the feveral Claufes, Powers, Directions, Penalties, and Forfeitures, relating thereto, were particularly repeated and again enacted in the body of this prefent Act; and that all the monies that shall arise by the faid duties, (except the necessary charges of raising, collecting, levying, recovering, answering, paying, and accounting for the fame), fhall be paid by the Collector of his Majelty's Cultoms, into the hands of His Majefly's Receiver-general in the faid Province for the time being, and thall be applied, in the first place in making a more certain and adequate provision, towards defraying the Expences of the administration of Justice, and of the support of Civil Covernment, in the faid province; and that the Lord high Trealurer, or Commiffioners of His Majefty's Treafury, or any three or more of them for the time being, shall be, and is or are hereby impowered, from time to time, by any Warrant or Warrants under his or their hand or hands, to caufe fuch money to be applied out of the faid produce of the faid Duties, towards defraying the faid Expences; and that the refidue of the faid duties shall remain and be referved in the hands of the faid ! eceiver-general, for the future disposition of Parliament.

III. And it is hereby further enacted by the authority aforefaid, That if any Goods chargeable with any of the faid duties herein before mentioned thall be brought into the faid Province by land carriage, the fame fliall pass and be carried through the port of Saint John's near the River Sorrel; or if finch goods fhall be brought into the faid province by the inland navigation, other than upon the River Saint Lawrence the fame shall pass and be carried upon the faid river Sorrel, by the faid port, and shall be there entered with, and the faid respective rates and duties paid for the fame, to fuch Officer or Officers of His Majefty's Cuftoms as shall be there appointed for that purpole; and if any fuch goods coming by land carriage, or Inland navigation, as aforesaid, shall pass by or beyond the faid place before named, without entry or payment of the faid rates and duties, or shall be brought into any part of the faid province. by or through any other place whatfoever, the faid goods thall be forfeited; and every perfon who shall be affisting, or otherwise concerned in the bringing or removing fuch goods, or to whofe hands the fame shall come, knowing that they were brought or removed contrary to this Act, fhall forfeit treble the value of fuch goods, to be estimated and computed according to the best price that each respective commodity bears in the Town
