A Montreal despatch says: President T. Emmett Quinn of the National Hockey Association said today that, so far as he knew, no further action would be taken against Joe Hall as a result of the Hall-Lalonde incident at the Arena on Wednescay night, when Lalonde was charged from behind by the Quebec "bad man" and smashed headforemost into the fence, sustaining serious injuries. It is said that the Canadien management are securing a number of affidavits from spectators who were close by when the incident happened, to show that the assault was deliberately perpetrated. It is possible that the Canadiens will press for the expulsion of Hall from the league.
