## BUILDING BRISK IN ST. CLAIR DISTRICT

Great Demand for Stores and Residences at Moderate Rates—Prospects Bright.

"The outlook for real estate sales in the northeast district is very fair," said Alex. Gordon of the A. Gordon Realty Company, Royal George Chambers, Earlscourt, to The World on Saturday. "Two months ago the prospect was not bright, but money is easier now, and a number of inquiries have come thru for store sites, and single lots for house building."

There are also requests for farm lands. A large apartment house is being erected in north Earlscourt," continued Mr. Gordon, "and J. Knibb has completed four large solid brick modern houses on Lansdowne avenue, and is about to erect a \$10,000 dwelling house on Ferndale avenue."

"The outlook for house building is bright for this district, and it is claimed that the northeast district is the busiest section in Toronto."

**Want Moderate Rents.**  
"There is a good demand for stores and houses at a moderate rental. High-priced houses are not much in demand, but are holding their value notwithstanding present conditions."

J. E. Tupling, wholesale newsagent, has found his present premises too small for his increasing business, and has purchased a site in St. Clair avenue, upon which he will erect a handsome solid brick store.

Within the last three months a number of modern business premises have been opened on St. Clair avenue, between Caledonia and Oakwood, and a large number of houses are in various stages of erection. Mr. Gordon states that fire and life insurance is good in the district, and his firm has sold a number of policies recently.

Thomas Clarke, Innes avenue, a member of the Earlscourt Baptist Church, has presented to the church thru the Rev. W. F. Roadhouse, a very handsome communion service. It will be remembered that the communion service was stolen some time ago, and the set was not recovered.

## Passenger Traffic

The sole head of a family, or any male over eighteen years old, may homestead quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta.
