showing the building before its last addition was erected. It was built by the Canadian Pacific Railroad, at a cost of over one million dollars, and is operated by them. It is located upon Dufferin Terrace, just below the citadel, and commands a view both up and down the river as far as the eye can see and across the river to Levis. No grander site for a hotel could be found on the continent. The beauty of the scenery cannot be described. It is a spot of great historic note, having been the site of the residence of many of the governors of Canada.
