KEY TO THE REPRESENTATION OF SOUNDS.

<i>é</i> , as in <i>pate</i> .	<i>ö</i> , as in <i>bone</i> .	<i>ä</i> , <i>u</i> , <i>eu</i> , — see Note.
<i>è</i> , as in <i>pat</i> .	<i>ö</i> , as in <i>pot</i> .	<i>g</i> , always hard, as in <i>go</i> .
<i>ai</i> , as in <i>pair</i> .	<i>oo</i> , as in <i>moon</i> .	<i>j</i> , as <i>g</i> in <i>gin</i> .
<i>ah</i> , as <i>a</i> in <i>balm</i> .	<i>I</i> , as in <i>pine</i> .	<i>zh</i> , as <i>z</i> in <i>azure</i> .

NOTE.—The letter *ü* represents the French "mute e," somewhat like *u* in *but*. *U* and *eu*, in *italics*, represent the French sounds of those letters, which have no English equivalent. The sound of *ng* or of *n* may be used instead of the French nasal.
