

Hockey 66 Teams In O.H.A.

Note and Comment

The Prof. Sphinx ringing case attracted considerable attention in the trotting horse world, being brought to a proper termination on Tuesday before the board of appeals of the U.S. National Trotting Association in New York. The chestnut gelding Jack London was sanguined on the half-mile track this year under the alias of Prof. Sphinx, and in six classes to which his record of 2.124 rendered him ineligible.

All this and other evidence had been gathered by Secretary W. H. Gocher, who obtained the identification of the supposed ringer from his old master, Dell McLean. As a result A. E. Richardson, a driver from Flint, Mich., was expelled for entering Jack London and racing him under his alias.

What the board considered an incriminating circumstance was a letter McLain received this fall, offering him money if he would fail to identify his former pupil as the Prof. Sphinx that had won most of his races. The offer was \$1000. Secretary Gocher had been in correspondence with Richardson, and an expert handwriting declared the incriminating missive corresponded with his signature.

James J. Roberts of Webster, Mass., who bought the trotter, thought his son came before the board and declared he had no guilty knowledge of the case. The Prof. Sphinx is owned by a man named Mr. F. C. Alexander, who has sold it to Charles W. Barnum, a state trooper from Lime Rock, Conn., after his tour as Professor of the year. The horse could be restored to favor on the restoration of his unlawful winnings.

These amounts were some \$1000 and it is said Mr. Roberts promptly handed them over to the Webster Bank. The latter purchased the gelding three years ago, paying it, it is understood, \$6000 for the first trotter, then known as Prof. Sphinx. Undoubtedly he has had a record of 2.114 at Albany Park last September, but having been engaged in the 2.20 and 2.24 classes at the Mineola Park, Long Island, started and won two purses of \$1000 the next week.

Bidders returning the purse money, which will be distributed among the next four horses, there is a possibility of a change of name and when this is also paid, Senator Barnes has a trotter eligible for the year next year and he can call him any name he pleases. The turf tribunal was composed of C. Conroy, Patrick, San Francisco; William Russell, St. Louis; H. N. Bain, Poughkeepsie, and P. H. Wall of Ottawa.
