YORK COUNTY AND SUBURBS RATEPAYERS AT BEACHES WILL FIGHT THE RAILWAY

Committee Appointed and Funds Raised at Indignation Meeting—Labor Candidates.

"Resolved that the residents and property owners of the district known as Kew and Balm Beach, and the Town of East Toronto, view with alarm and apprehension several railway surveys lately made at the lake front, and thru the heart of the locality, which would effectually destroy the beauty and value of the district for residential purposes, and depreciate the value fully 50 per cent.

This was the decision of a mass meeting called by Mayor Richardson in Balm Beach clubhouse last night. A resolution also endorsed the proposal to reserve the lake front and Armstrong bridge's Bay to the town for all time to come.

Under the Railway Act there was no appeal from the entry of surveyors and trial lines could be run even when injury resulted. He favored the common right of way along the line of the Grand Trunk railway of all roads entering the city from the east.

H. J. P. Eckardt, J. J. Dixon, C. T. Lyon, H. C. Nassim, and Mr. Hardy wanted immediate action, and Councilor Nassim suggested the creation of a fund to carry on the work of a committee. A subscription list opened with a donation of \$50 from J. J. Dixon and \$157 was secured in a few minutes.
