

Says They Live in Luxury and Sell Bibles and Prayer Books and Take the People's Money.



MOST PROSPEROUS YEAR.

teports Presented to the Toronto Board of Harbor Commissioners Yesterday.

Reports presented at the annual meet-ing of the Toronto Board of Harbor Commissioners, held yesterday morning at the Board of Trade, showed that the past year had been the most prosperous on record. had been the most prosperous on record. The dues collected at this port were \$11,558, an increase of \$1600 over the year 1898. The working expenses were \$5000. During the year 255 more vessels arrived than in the previous season. The total tonnage of the vessels was 2,500,000. The amount of coal brought to Toronto by rall and water was 725,000 tons, as compared with 662,000 tons for the previous year. Mr. A. B. Lee was in the chair.

FRANCE SUSPENDS DUTIES On Coal and Iron and Steel Owing

to the Present Economic Short-age in Supply. Paris, Jan. 12.-In the Chamber of Deputles to-day, M. Breton, Socialist, moved a temporary suspension of the duties on im temporary suspension of the duties on imports of coal, in view of the economic crisis due to the shortage in the supply. He pointed out that the protectionist, M. Meilne, had not hesitated two years ago to suspend the duties on wheat in an analogous case.

M. Cailloux, moderate Republican, moved that the proposal be referred to the Customs Committee, which was agreed to.

M. Breton then moved to suspend the duties on imported iron and steel. The motion was also referred to the Customs Committee.
