

bert Dickson was sent yesterday to St. Thomas, where interment took place. The fumeral was held from the residence of his step-son, W. Huff, 11 Josephine street, Chelsea Green, the hearse bearing the remains being taken from there to Thompson avenue and Ralph's Lane in Westminster. At that point, three weeks ego, the horse which Mr. Dickson was driving was startled by a large yellow motor car standing on the road. Mr. Dickson had a short time previous to that lost two of the fingers of his right hand in an accident at the Richards-Wilcox Company, and because of this, it is thought, was unable to hold the startled animal. He was thrown against a fence, and received injuries which caused his death in Victoria Hospital here on Sun-day. 




