

Their body warmth should be maintained by additional clothing, though it is well to remember that the less clothing one wears at any time, consistent with physical comfort, the better for health. The hot air furnace does dry out the air, but not more than the radiator does. If the apartment is constantly overheated, it is practically impossible to maintain anything like normal to maintain anything like normal humidity in the air by any apparatus available for the private dwelling. But if the temperature is kept below 68 degrees Fahrenheit, a fair approach to proper moisture in the air may be maintained if the water pots of the furnace are large and well filled. It requires something like 75 gallons of water daily, evaporated in the air, to maintain fair humidity in an artificially heated dwelling of average size in cold

As a matter of economy, efficiency and hygiene, let the householder rest assured that the hot air furnace is thoroughly correct.
