



HOSTEL NOT PLANNED **CHILDREN'S AID WILL LOOK AFTER ORPHANS**

Building Would Not Have Been Permanent, Merely Clearing House, Stated.

After conferring with Alderman F. E. Harley and Secretary Ed Lance of the Soldiers' Aid Commission on Friday afternoon, Joseph Warwick, provincial secretary of the Soldiers' Aid Commission, said that a hostel for soldiers' children would not be established here, as there was not a sufficient number of children to warrant it. However, arrangements were made by the provincial secretary whereby all soldiers' children in need of care of any kind would be looked after by the Children's Aid Society at the Thomas Alway Home on Wharncliffe road, and the commission would pay any expenses in this connection.

Had the hostel been established in London, it would not have been a permanent home for the children, but merely a clearing house where they could stay temporarily until foster parents were found for them or the care that was necessary had been given them. Mr. Warwick was not in the city today, solely for the idea of ascertaining whether a hostel was needed, but to make a survey of the work for the children in general. Mrs. Lawson of Toronto, who is connected with the soldiers' aid commission, has been in the city for several days investigating the work. Mr. Warwick was accompanied by George A. Stevenson of Toronto, who is supervisor of children's work.

CYCLISTS GET WORST IN PAIR OF ACCIDENTS


